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General Uses and Disclosures of PHI

Policy

NYU Langone Health **may** Use and Disclose Protected Health Information (“PHI”):

- for Treatment, Payment and Health Care Operations,
- to the patient or p

reasonable administrative, technical, and physical safeguards to limit incidental Uses and Disclosures of PHI and comply with the minimum necessary requirements.

State and federal laws require additional safeguards for the release of information that is deemed especially sensitive, such as Confidential HIV-Related Information, alcohol and drug abuse information, psychiatric information, genetic information, and reproductive health information. In most situations, a special Authorization or attestation is required before releasing any of this type of information. Workforce members should consult with the Sensitive PHI policy before using or disclosing sensitive PHI.
